Recycle anything with a plug!
Bring phones, cell phones,
small appliances, household
electronics, printers, VCRs,
CD players, fax machines, etc.



Open to Salem residents and
property owners with ID or tax bill.

Most items are free, including laptops and computer towers. \$20 per unit for computers, TVs, monitors and large appliances such as refrigerators, air conditioners, freezers, and stoves. Bring cash or a check made payable to RMG (the vendor).

Update on Mercury Recycling:

Items containing mercury are no longer accepted at E-Waste. Instead, bring these items to Salem's Department of Public Services, 5 Jefferson Ave., during regular City business hours.

- shoe repair

- ceramics gluing
- Our seamstresses offer hand and machine sewing, buttons, hemming, darning, patching, minor alterations
- Bring an old (small) t-shirt, and if time allows, our master seamstress, Alexa, will convert it to a reusable bag!

Important Note: If your garment has a broken zipper, bring a new zipper with you. If your electronics requires testing after repair, please bring what is needed to do that (light bulb, CD, DVD, vhs tape).
