Disposal of Specific Items:

<i>Item</i>	<i>Suggestions for disposal</i>
Plastic Bags	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Local grocery stores – NEVER place in recycling cart
Books	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All can be recycled except anything cloth bound. Donate to schools, nursing homes or hospitals. Goodwill has drop-off locations in the parking lot of the Peabody Stop & Shop (19 Howley Street) and Swampscott Stop & Shop (450 Paradise Road). SalemRecycles Book Swaps or Swap 'N' Drop.
Construction or demolition debris (carpeting, wood, concrete, wall coverings, electric wires, windows, metal, doors, asphalt, bricks, etc.)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Look in Yellow Pages or Newspapers for contractors (disposal service, trash) to dispose of these items. The Mass Gov Site provides information on disposal of construction and demolition waste. Visit saalem.com/recycling - alternatives for household junk and demolition debris
Useful items that can be used by others (toys, furniture, clothes, etc.)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Goodwill has drop-off locations in the parking lot of the Peabody Stop & Shop (19 Howley Street) and Swampscott Stop & Shop (450 Paradise Road). Lifebridge Salem Thrift Store Salvation Army, Veterans, Big Brothers Big Sisters (may pick-up) Local churches, day care centers or thrift stores (call to check for requirements for donations)
Hazardous Waste	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> City has periodic Hazardous Waste Days (typically last Saturday in September at Salem High School). Contact Salem Board of Health for details 978-619-5654. City of Beverly will have a Hazardous Waste Day- typically third Saturday in April.
