E-Waste Collection - Saturday, March 30 Salem High School, 77 Willson St. 8 am - noon Recycle Anything with a Plug!

Drop off computer towers; laptops & tablets; cell phones; small and large appliances, household electronics, phones, printers, fax machines--home and business, CD Players, VCRs and more.

Most items are free, except for TVs, monitors, and appliances containing freon (refrigerators, A/C, dehumidifiers and freezers), which are \$20 per unit. Only cash or checks will be accepted.

E-waste collection is only open to Salem residents or property owners.

**Note: Items containing mercury**, including CFL light bulbs, can be brought to Salem Dept. Public Services (Public Works) at 5 Jefferson Avenue during regular City business hours--Mon, Tues, Wed – 8 am-4 pm; Thursday, 8 am – 7 pm, Friday 8am – noon.

- Electronics and computer diagnostics (No TVs)
- Wood furniture gluing and repair
