Don't Trash It, Fix It! At the Fall Repair Cafe

Saturday, November 2, 9 AM - Noon, at the <u>Bridge at 211</u>

SalemRecycles and The Bridge at 211 are cosponsoring this community-based gathering of skilled volunteers who will mend, repair and

restore your broken items, keeping them from the waste stream.

Repairs include:

- Sewing by hand or machine: mend, patch, hem, darn, fix buttons
- Sharpening scissors & knives
- Tinkering with electronics and gagets; no TVs
- Rewiring and fixing lamps
- Gluing ceramics
- Basic jewelry repairing
- Repairing furniture and wood gluing
- And just about anything that can be repaired with adhesives or fasteners, such as basic shoe repairs.



Please bring any replacement items that might be required, such as a new zipper or electric cords & plugs. If your electronics require testing after repair, bring what is needed to do that (i.e., light bulb, DVD, VHS tape).

Bring only one or two items (more will be allowed only if time is available). The last items will be taken at 11:30.

This is open only to **Salem residents**. Park in the small lot at 211 Bridge St, or park nearby. Enter via lower level door on Bridge Street.

Send them to pumpkin heaven at this fun community composting event in the parking lot at Dead Horse Beach.

<u>Black Earth Compost</u> will be on hand with a truck, complete with basketball hoop for those who are willing to try it out!



Check this out—SAFE is providing six months of free curbside composting--valued at \$50--to the first 10 Salem residents who sign up for this service. (Only open to those who are not already subscribers.)

Why compost? Disposing of food waste is expensive & creates greenhouse gases and other toxic emissions. Composting is nature's ultimate recycling, turning left overs and food waste into healthy rich organic soil!

after this event. They will be trashed.

Q: I'm the kind of person who likes to recycle or compost everything I can, including small pieces of paper. Can I recycle or compost cash register receipts?

A: Unfortunately, neither. Most receipts are printed on thermal paper which is coated with Bisphenol-A (BPA), a toxic chemical. These receipts must be thrown in the trash.



While we're on the subject, please note that **any pieces of paper** smaller than a credit card cannot be recycled. They fall through the cracks at the sorting facility and are trashed. Little bits of paper can be composted.

Good News for Recycling in Salem

Salem's recycling efforts are improving! A recent audit by Waste Management showed a drop in contamination, from a high of 28% last year, down to 14.8% this fall. Our goal is 10%. We're getting close...keep up the good work!
