Please note the event is not open to the public until 10am, but donations will be accepted starting at 9am. No book dealers or more than two bags per swapper before noon. At close of event, Discover Books will take the unswapped books and media to be donated or recycled.




MA DEP Waste Bans

MassDEP issued its final 2030 Solid Waste Master Plan, which establishes goals to reduce disposal statewide by 30 percent (from 5.7 million tons in 2018 to 4 million tons in 2030) over the next decade. Among its strategies for reaching these objectives, MassDEP will expand its current waste disposal bans by adding mattresses and textiles to the list of materials banned from disposal or transport for disposal in Massachusetts, and lowering the threshold on commercial organic/food waste to facilities generating more than one-half ton of these materials per week.

This means there will be some changes to the way we collect mattresses not only in Salem, but state wide. The components of mattresses can be recycled - box springs and steel inner-springs can be recycled and made into new steel, mattress foam can be ground up and mixed with binders to form padding and cushions, and box spring and foundation wood can be chipped and used as animal bedding, mulch or biomass fuel. We have not yet reached a final decision on who will be collecting our mattresses in Salem but stay tuned for more details.

Salem has already made great strides for textile recycling including partnering with HELPSY to provide annual textile drives and weekly curbside pick ups and Bay State Textile's public school collection bins. We need to continue these efforts by ensuring textiles, clothing, fabric, etc do not end up in our curbside trash. Even if they are worn, torn, stained or have a hole, they can still be recycled into new fabrics.



Plant Pots

As gardening season begins, you may find yourself with plastic plant and flower pots. They are not recyclable curbside, but can be reused. The Salem Community Gardens is collecting them, please contact

- Compressed Gas Cylinders, Helium Tanks
- Prescription Medicine (Medication Drop Box 24/7 @ Beverly Police Station & Beverly Hospital, Main Entrance)
- Syringes (drop of f@ Beverly Hospital, Main Entrance, Sharps Kiosk 24/7 & Beverly Police Station)
- Commercial or Industrial Waste Asbestos
- Infectious Biological & Radioactive Waste

How do I safely transport these hazardous materials?

17" or Less ONLY

Off Rims

- · Leave materials in original container
- Tighten caps & lids. Pack containers in sturdy, upright boxes & pad with newspaper. DO NOT place in a garbage bag. Sort & pack separately.
- · NEVER MIX CHEMICALS Never smoke while handling hazardous materials. Pack your vehicle & go directly to the site.
